School Uniform

We pride ourselves on our children looking smart, and it is often commented on by visitors to the school as to how nice it is to see the children wearing their uniform with pleasure and honour. However, we have noticed recently that some children are deviating from our policy and would like to remind you that:

- trousers, skirts and pinafores should be grey (not black), and leggings should not be worn on their own instead of trousers.
- PE hoodies should be worn as part of PE kit and not instead of a school jumper/cardigan.
- school shoes should be sensible, practical and <u>black;</u> trainers should only be worn as part of PE kit.
