Message from the Head

I attended the Friends of Keevil School (FoKS) AGM this week, and I was bowled over by the enthusiasm and commitment that so many family members show to the school and the difference that this makes for all of the children here. For those of you who are newer to our community, in the past year alone FoKS has funded: a new kitchen in the staffroom so that children can do cooking in school; a number of trips including to the theatre, Langford Lakes and Butterfly World; playground equipment; workshops from artists, musicians and authors; hoodies, year books and treats for our Y6 Leavers; amongst many other things and experiences. During the meeting we discussed what FoKS could support this year and trips and visitors to the school are high up the list, but also it was agreed that they would get new cooking equipment, new books for Summer Class, new outdoor toys and play equipment for Winter Class, and toys and decoration for the new school wall once this is complete. All of these things mean that the children get to experience a depth and breadth of curriculum that goes beyond that which is prescribed by the Government through the National Curriculum. Some of this learning is related to specific subjects or topics within the academic curriculum, but much is about the children being enabled to grow and develop as individuals through a richness of experiences and opportunities. As we discussed at the meeting, these are the memories that stay with the children and mean the most to them as they grow up and move on in their lives. If you were unable to attend the meeting but would like to offer your time and talents (however great or small these may be!) to FoKS, if you come and let us know in the school office then we can pass your details on to the FoKS Committee. On behalf of myself, the other staff and all the children, many thanks for all your hard work in helping to make our school even better.

Music Mark

We are proud to announce that we have been invited to become a Music Mark school for the second year running. This is in recognition of our continuing commitment to high quality music education. As well as daily singing in worship, all children at Keevil have a weekly music lesson with a specialist music teacher. This year we have started a band (invitation only depending on ability) and a choir which is open to all children from year 1-6. Both these ensembles will be performing at the Christmas carol service. Rehearsals have also been happening for the Reception and KS1 Nativity, and the Summer class Christmas concert. We can't wait to show you all our hard work.



Piece of the Term – Troika by Prokofiev (1934)

Lieutenant Kije was Prokofiev's first attempt at writing film music. After the film's successful release, the music was adapted into a 5 movement 'Kije' suite. It became one for Prokofiev's best-known works. The film score comprises of 16 short fragments which are repeated through the film at appropriate times. Adapting the music for the orchestral suite was hard as these musical ideas needed to be shaped into a suitable structure for a concert piece. Troika is the 4th Movement from the suite. The melody begins slowly but soon picks up the pace to give the impression of a rapid journey by means of a troika – a traditional Russian 3-horse sled. This tune is often played around Christmas time and was famously used in 'I believe in Father Christmas' by Greg Lake in 1974.
