Message from the Head

Our Worship theme for this term is 'Thankfulness' in the lead up to our Harvest Festival, which takes place in St Leonard's Church next Tuesday, 3rd October, at 9:15am. So far in Worship we have been thinking about thanking the people who help us, and our gratitude for the beautiful world we live in. Our Harvest Festival gives us the opportunity to show our thankfulness for the world around us and all the good things we have been given. It is also a chance to show our thankfulness for all the new children and families who have joined our community. Family members are very welcome to join us for the service, and the Church will be serving tea and coffee beforehand so you are welcome to go and wait there once you have dropped your child at school at 8:45am. During the service we collect gifts of food and household stables which we donate to The Storehouse Foodbank in Trowbridge. This year they have asked especially for donations of: tins of meat, tins of vegetables, tins of potatoes, small bags of sugar, and small jars of coffee. They have also asked for NO tins of baked beans and spaghetti, or bags of pasta. Children should bring their gifts into school on the morning of the Harvest Festival and will carry them up to the Church for the service

Although it feels like we have only just started a new year at school, it is also the time where we need to think about children who will be starting school (primary or secondary) in September 2024. For families of children in Y6, applications for secondary places need to be submitted via the Wiltshire Council parent portal by October 31st. For children who will be starting school for the first time in Reception next year, there is slightly longer to make the choice as the application deadline is 15th January 2024. For a small school like ours, it is vital that we maintain good numbers of children choosing to join us, despite the fact that birth rates have fallen significantly in recent years and there are fewer children needing school places each year. A number of the other small village schools in the Acorn Education Trust have been moved to a 3 class structure this year due to their declining numbers. The 4 class model we currently have is something I am very keen to protect, as we feel it enables us to give the children the best possible academic curriculum whilst


