Message from the Head

Welcome back to school! I hope you had a good break over the half-term holiday, and managed to avoid at least some of the rain...

Term 4 is the time of year in which we undertake to consult with and listen to all members of our school community. We feel we are far enough into the year for everyone to be settled into new routines and expectations and as such are able to give meaningful feedback, but it also leaves us enough time to make a difference if there is anything that people feel could be improved in some way. As well, it is the point of the school year in which we start planning for the next academic year, and so the voices of all our stakeholders are able to contribute to that process.

Over the course of this term we will be conducting a pupil voice questionnaire with all our children, to understand how school feels for them and what works and doesn't work for them. We also run a staff questionnaire, to give all members of staff the opportunity to highlight the aspects of the school that they feel are effective and those that could be improved, as well as suggest new ideas that could be tried. In addition, we also ask you as parents/carers to complete a questionnaire to give us your views about the school. The questionnaire is based on the Ofsted Parent View survey and is designed to give an overall snapshot of your and your child's experience of the school. As Ofsted use the same the survey for every setting that they inspect, the questions are quite generic. We have therefore, included some extra information alongside each question to help prompt you to think about what this means for our school.

We ask for all responses to be completed by **Friday 8**th **March**. Any submitted after this time we are afraid will not be considered or included in our analysis.

You have the opportunity to complete the questionnaire anonymously, but there is also the option to include your name and contact details if there are any responses or comments that you would like to discuss with me in more detail. Please remember that if you have any issues or concerns specific to your child, this is not the most effective forum in which to address these. Your child's class teacher is always your best first port of call, followed by me. I know that all of our teachers will always do their utmost to work with you in the best interests of your child.

There will be one further way in which we will be consulting with you all this term, and that will be through another short online questionnaire that will be sent out soon. This has been designed by parents/carers who support the school through roles on the Academy Council and FoKS and is seeking to find and share ways in which pupils' families can make a significant difference to the school and the opportunities that we can provide for all the children.

All children are invited into their classes at 6pm on Thursday 7th March wearing pyjamas and with a teddy or cushion! We will make sure everyone has a lovely story and a hot chocolate. 

Piece of the Term - The Blue Danube by Johann Strauss II (1866)

This famous piece of music was originally intended to be a choral work for the Vienna Men's Choral Society. The poem that inspired the music frequently mentioned 'the beautiful blue Danube' which is a river that runs through central and south-eastern Europe including Austria which is where the composer was born. Soon after its premiere performance, Strauss reorchestrated the work as an instrumental piece, which has now become the more famous version. This unofficial national anthem of Austria can be found in several examples of popular culture today. The most famous being the docking scene in the film '2001: A Space Odyssey'. Strauss was a prolific composer of waltzes, polkas and other types of dance music. This music is a waltz which means it has 3 beats in a bar; one very strong beat followed by 2 weaker beats. Art Work of the Term - The Goldfish by Henri Matisse (1912)

Matisse was a French artist, known for his use of colour. He was also a draughtsman, printmaker, and sculptor, but is known best for his paintings. Goldfish were introduced to Europe from East Asia in the 17th century and from around 1912, goldfish became a recurring subject in his work and they appear in no less than nine of his paintings, as well as in his drawings and prints. **The Goldfish**, 1912 belongs to a series that Matisse produced between spring and early summer 1912.
